## PASTORAL CARE

In accordance with the Lasallian philosophy of education which seeks to educate the whole person, De La Salle College is noted for its pastoral approach and concern for the welfare of each student in their care. We have a strong support system in place. The school has a pastoral care team that looks after the wellbeing of students and identifies and works with students who may be having difficulties for a variety of reasons. Those with roles involved in pastoral care include: Principal, Deputy Principal, Guidance Counsellor, SEN coordinator and Class Tutors. The school employs a number of supports to help students settle into life at second level including; Homework Club, Games Club, Peer Mentoring, Paired Literacy Programme and Paired Numeracy Programme.

# LEARNING SUPPORT

We are particularly proud of the support given to students with additional educational needs at both ends of the spectrum, to both gifted students and students with learning difficulties. This support operates on a number of levels. Each class teacher takes into account the needs of each individual student and provides differentiated learning opportunities to both challenge and support students. We also have dedicated learning support teachers who provide specialised support to students on a one-to-one or small group basis to help enhance their learning. Learning Support is coordinated by Ms. Kathy Hinchion.

# AUTISIC SPECTRUM DISORDER (ASD) PROGRAMMES



Students wishing to enrol in either of our ASD classes must have a psychological report recommending access to the class. Full details of the programmes are available from the programme coordinator Ms. Siobhan Angland

In addition to our SEN department support, we also offer two specific programmes for students with additional educational requirements.

#### **MODERATE ASD CLASS**

We opened our first ASD class in September 2016 to cater for students in the locality with a diagnosis of Autism with a mild to moderate ability. The maximum number of students in this class is six. Students in this class currently follow a Level 1 or 2 programme. The main aims of the programme are to develop key skills around literacy, numeracy, independent living, personal care, access to the community and preparing for work. The programme aims to develop student's full academic potential, while enabling them to live as fully and independently as possible. Each student has a curriculum tailored around their individual ability and needs.

Students in our ASD class engage the level 1 and 2 programmes and some of the highlights include:

- · Daily literacy and comprehension
- · Social skills and communication programme
- Gym programme
- Swimming
- Music lessons
- Cookery sessions
- Life Science
- Food education
- Daily Functional maths
- Planning events, such as charity bake sales
- Junior cycle short courses, such as caring for animals

#### SECOND ASD CLASS

In 2019 we opened our second ASD class. This class caters for students with a diagnosis of autism who would benefit from access to both mainstream curriculum as well as an ASD class. The aim of this programme is to offer a support system for our students to thrive academically, socially, and develop their independent life skills. The programme offers each student individualised, in-depth support in areas around functional life skills and social skills while supporting their academic and social participation in school life. Students in this programme benefit in a variety of ways, such as:

- Access to mainstream subjects and classes of choice with SNA support
- Individualised educational programme in their ASD class
- Support with mainstream subjects
- Organisational support
- Safe space
- Tailored social skills programme
- · Functional living skills programme
- Access to different educational levels with the opportunity to mix as appropriate

# INDUCTION PROGRAMME

A heavy emphasis is placed on De La Salle's Induction Programme, which is designed to help students deal with the sometimes challenging transition between primary and secondary education.

The Induction Programme begins with visits to the local primary schools. Prospective students visit the school on our Open Day. Our Fourth Year 'Buddies' show the enrolled students around the school in a relaxed manner, easing any worries about the new year. An Information night in September provides an opportunity for parents of new students to meet with the Principal and Guidance Counsellor, ask questions, learn more about subject choice and the support available in the school.

The 'buddies' continue to provide support to their students throughout the first year, including a bonding day trip together away from school.

# TRANSITION YEAR

The Transition Year (TY) programme provides students with the opportunity to discover their own talents and abilities whilst developing skills and competencies within a well-defined academic structure. It will challenge students to accept responsibility for their own learning, to improve their performance in core areas, develop their own interests, and to evaluate their progress. It will also introduce students to the world of adult work. Transition Year coordinator is Mr John Ryan. This compulsory year allows students to:

- Gain two/three weeks of work experience in a field of their choice.
- · Participate in the president's award; Gaisce.
- Participate in short courses including: Professional GAA Coaching, Certified First-aider, Driver Theory, Media Studies, Cooking, Yoga, Self Defence.
- Activity trips The students partake in a number of trips over the year such as: Carrauntoohil Climb, Gougane Barra Hike, Overnight in Outdoor Adventure Centre and Paintballing.
- Becoming competent in ICT in particular in ECDL and web-design.
- Participate in a two-week exchange programme to Bordeaux in France.
- Attend speakers and courses throughout the year specially selected with the students' personal, social and vocational development in mind.





## **SPORT**

De La Salle College has a proud tradition of excellence on the playing field and has long been associated with producing some of Cork's finest footballers throughout the years. # **EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES**

For the past 25 years De La Salle College has had an annual exchange programme with a sister De La Salle College in Bordeaux, France.

The fourth and second year students spend up to two weeks in Bordeaux with a host family where they have an opportunity to improve their French and also learn about the French way of life.

The school is very proud of this long running exchange programme which is the longest school exchange programme in Ireland. The return of the French students to the Irish host families is always greatly looked forward to by the school and the wider community of Macroom.

For the past 12 years De La Salle College has also run an exchange programme with the Italian town of Marcallo Con Cassone which is in Northern Italy, close to Milan. The first year students are usually accommodated in houses in pairs which helps with the settling in process while a trip to the amusements park Gardaland and the San Siro Stadium in Milan are well noted as some of the highlights of the trip.

## SCHOOL INSPECTIONS

The fully-rounded nature of the educational experience at De La Salle College is what sets our school apart.
