#### **Summary of findings**

Overall, the school has made either good or very good progress in implementing most recommendations in the WSE MLL report. There was partial implementation of the recommendation on Physical Education and this requires further attention as a matter of priority. Other aspects that require attention are the finalisation of the health and safety policy, and extension of effective practices relating to the use of collaborative learning strategies and provision of formative written commentary to students.

#### Recommendations

- Physical Education should be provided for all students, including those in fifth year and sixth year.
- Risk assessments should be carried out and included in the safety statement. The amended health and safety policy should then be ratified by the board.
- Effective practices relating to the use of collaborative learning strategies and the provision of formative written commentary to students should be extended.

The board of management was given an opportunity to comment in writing on the findings and recommendations of the report, and the response of the board will be found in the appendix of this report.
